
First Holiday Decoration Sale A Success!

2017 Author Dinner to feature Christine Carbo May 17.

The Lewistown Public Library is pleased to announce Christine Carbo as the guest speaker for the 2017 Annual Author Dinner. Christine Carbo is the author of *The Wild Inside and Mortal Fall*, the first two novels in her suspense series about Glacier Park. Christine grew up in Gainesville, FL then moved to Kalispell, MT when she was twelve.

After receiving a Masters in English/Linguistics at University of Montana at Missoula, Carbo began teaching English courses at Flathead Valley Community College in her hometown of Kalispell. When she wasn't working as a technical writer and teaching, she was raising her son and became involved in Pilates. Ultimately, breaking away from technical writing and opening her own Pilates studio afforded her the flexibility to write creatively again. She began her work on a mystery series based in Glacier Park and has published two novels to that effect, *The Wild Inside* and *Mortal Fall*.

Currently, Christine and her husband, Jamie, live in Whitefish with three kids, one dog and a cat.

The 7th Annual Author Dinner will be Wednesday, May 17, 2017 at the Elk's Club. The evening will feature a catered dinner, a silent auction and time to visit and listen to Christine Carbo.
