
2015 Author Dinner to feature Malcolm Brooks

The Lewistown Public Library is pleased to announce Malcolm Brooks as the guest speaker for the 2015 Annual Author Dinner. Brooks' debut novel,

Painted Horses, has received starred reviews and was awarded the Fall 2014 Barnes and Novel Discover Great New Writers selection, the 2014 National Reading Group Month Selection, and is #22 on Amazon's 100 Best Books of 2014. Set in the mid-1950s in Montana, Painted Horses is reminiscent of the work of Wallace Stegner and Thomas McGuane.



The novel sends a dauntless young woman on a heroic



quest, sings a love song to the horseman's vanishing way of life, and reminds us that love and ambition, tradition and the future often make strange bedfellows. Malcolm Brooks was raised in the foothills of the California Sierras, where Gold Rush and Native American artifacts still abound. A carpenter by trade, he has lived in Montana for 20 years. His writing has appeared in Gray's Sporting Journal, Outside, Sports Afield and Montana Quarterly and among others.

The 5th Annual Author Dinner will be Wednesday, May 20 at the Elk's Club. The evening features a catered dinner, a silent auction and time to visit and listen to Malcolm Brooks. Tickets go on sale April 1, available at the Library or from any Library Board Trustee. The event is sponsored by the Friends of the Library. Save the date and we look forward to seeing you this spring!

Librarian Dan Bell's Favorite Non-Fiction

During long winter nights, why not lose yourself in a good nonfiction book? The first one I wholeheartedly recommend is Dan Jones' *The Plantagenets: The Warrior Kings and Queens Who Made England.* The book serves as an exhaustive tour of the Middle Ages, chronicling court intrigue, murder, jousting tournaments, the Crusades, the Black Death and internecine feuds pitting father against son, husband against wife. It is a 500 page narrative history, but you'll be rewarded with a veritable "game of thrones".

Next up is *Pocahontas and the Powhatan Dilemma* by Camilla Townsend, a professional historian's revision of the traditional story. You know it well if you have seen the Disney movie, Terrence Malick's The New World or survived a 7th grade social studies class similar to mine. Townsend continuously explodes many of the myths surrounding Pocahontas, instead relying on documentary and contemporary evidence to reveal the young woman's life. Perhaps the only place the author loses her scholarly cool is in the portrayal of John Smith, which turns out to be a highly entertaining treatment of the adventurer.

Another good nonfiction read is *A Commonwealth of Thieves: The Improbable Birth of Australia* by Thomas Keneally. Probably best known for his novel Schindler's List, Keneally applies first-rate prose to the founding of his native land, in the process elucidating eighteenth-century colonization, criminal theory and European-Aboriginal relations. He also details an ill-fated escape attempt made by Irish-speaking convicts who hoped to reach China on foot through the Australian Outback.

Pick up one of these recent additions to the Library's nonfiction collection and let me know what you think. Or ask me about other non-fiction favorites.
